



School Safety Reporting Policy

In accordance with HB2119-A.R.S. § 15-153, CASA Academy is required to report to local law enforcement any suspected crime against a person or property that is a “serious offense” or involves a “deadly weapon” or “dangerous instrument” or “serious physical injury” as defined by relevant state statute. CASA Academy is also required to report any conduct that poses a threat of death or “serious physical injury,” as defined by relevant state statute, to an employee, student or other person on school property. Furthermore, CASA Academy will notify the parent or guardian of each student who is involved in a suspected crime or any conduct described above.

CASA Academy’s Director of Students and Operations is the employee responsible for making the report to local law enforcement. In the case that the Director of Students and Operations is unable to make the report, the CEO will make the report in his/her place.

CASA Academy requires employees to comply with reporting requirements, will maintain a record regarding any employee who is disciplined under the policy, and, on request, will make that record available to any public school that is considering hiring that person.

If a CASA Academy employee fails to comply with the state’s reporting requirements, CASA Academy may discipline the employee, up to and including termination of employment.
